

**PITT COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
GREENVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA  
JANUARY 24, 2000**

The Pitt County Board of Commissioners met in a regular session on Monday, January 24, 2000, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Auditorium, Pitt County Office Building, 1717 W. 5<sup>th</sup> Street, Greenville, North Carolina. **CALL TO ORDER - Chairman Gaskins**

**INVOCATION** given by Commissioner James.

**PLEDGE** led by Commissioner Johnson.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA - Chairman Gaskins**

Vice Chairman Hammond motioned to add to the agenda a discussion about inviting guest Ministers to come and share by doing the invocation at each meeting and that he would make the arrangements. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion and the Board voted unanimously to add Vice Chairman Hammond's request to the agenda.

**UPON MOTION** by Commissioner Bowen, seconded Commissioner James, the Board voted unanimously to approve the agenda as amended.

**PUBLIC ADDRESSES TO THE BOARD**

Carrie Brown spoke on behalf of her husband, Derrick Brown who had his boat damaged when volunteering during the flooding. She stated that he was arrested on January 20<sup>th</sup> for a worthless check. She said Billy at Billy's Marine Repair told them that he had received a \$2,000 check from them and that Mr. John Bulow had told Billy to bring the check to him. She attempted to explain a process by which her husband was accused and arrested for writing a bad check to Billy's Marine Repair. She talked about it

being perjury if someone lies under oath. She said that Derrick Brown and his family deserve a public apology from all the people involved in his arrest.

Derrick Brown said he had two items to discuss. He said he took his claim to the committee that was chosen to look into damages of individuals that helped during the flood and said that it stated in Sunday's newspaper that if a claim is legitimate it would be paid. He said that Bennie Dobbs signed off for his community service hours while working during the flood and he worked a total of 36 hours. He said it had been two weeks since the committee was formed and he had not received reimbursement for his boat repairs. He read out a total of figures equaling over \$6,000 for damages and work time that he felt he was entitled to by the County. He said that Mr. Bulow lied to him and that the staff including the Manager, John Bulow, and county attorney, JoAnne Burgdorff had all perjured themselves by having him arrested. He said that Bennie Dobbs told John Bulow that the boat was in good condition. He stated he had paid Billy with a check and to hold the check as a promissory note. In addition, he said he gave the mechanic \$250 to give to Billy. He said he was wrongfully arrested for a worthless check and he was claiming the County owed him \$150,000 for slander, \$150,000 for other items and would leave this matter alone if they would settle out of court before Friday at a specific time. If the case was not settled, he said he will file a lawsuit against John Bulow, the Manager, and the Attorney for perjury and will claim \$3million for slander, \$3 million for pain and suffering and \$3 million malice imprisonment.

James Williams - asked to speak with Keith Cooper when he addressed the Resolution proclaiming the second week of May as "Senior Citizens Awareness Week."

John Bulow stated that he would like to clarify some of Mr. Derrick Brown's statements. He said he has never spoken to anyone at Billy's Marine. He said that Mr. Brown showed him a receipt but would not let him copy it. Mr. Bulow said he does not have powers of arrest and he does not make check charges, and any of the other suggestions that Mr. Brown made against him. He said the Board had a committee to investigate this situation including Vice Chairman Hammond, John Bulow, Sheriff Manning and Bobby Joyner. He said they met and discussed the matter and then asked Mr. Brown for more detailed information such as a summary with names of individuals who could verify his service. Mr. Bulow said that then Mr. Brown asked him for the Board members names and phone numbers and Mr. Bulow provided them to him. He said that was the last contact he had with Mr. Brown.

## **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

**UPON MOTION** by Vice Chairman Hammond, seconded by Commissioner James, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes from January 5, 2000, January 12, 2000, and January 14, 2000.

## **ITEMS FOR REPORT**

### **Report on Diabetes, Stroke and Heart Disease - Senator Ed Warren, Dr. Don Ensley and Dr. Pfifer**

Senator Warren thanked the Board for allowing him to address the Board. He said he wanted to report on the very positive things that have been happening in healthcare for Pitt County and the region. Dr. Don Ensley, will report on the Stroke and Heart Disease programs. Dr. Pfeifer, a nationally known physician who also publishes the "Diabetes Forecast" for the State of North Carolina would discuss diabetes. Ms. Carol Shields, employed by Pitt County Health Department, to coordinate the region and funding for heart disease in eastern North Carolina.

Senator Warren stated that he has had family members that have died from heart disease. Most deaths in eastern North Carolina are from heart disease and strokes. Dr. Chitwood, Heart Surgeon at Pitt County Memorial Hospital, is on the Board of Directors for this program. Senator Warren stated that he got \$250,000 approved by the Legislature to do a study on heart disease. They also applied for a \$6 million grant from the Federal government and have received \$6.2 million. Congress has rated this program as second in the country. Senator Warren stated that he chaired this Board about six years

ago. He said that there is a full time director, Libby Pector who is coordinating these programs. They started "Heart Day" in the General Assembly and they have started including heart healthy foods in the cafeteria. Pitt County is one of six counties to receive this money. He said they will receive \$500,000 to teach young people about heart disease and that Pitt County is a model for these programs in the Country. He said he takes pride in Pitt County being the leader in North Carolina.

Dr. Ensley, professor at ECU, spoke about strokes. He said the disease is rampant in eastern North Carolina. A task force is in place and doing a great job on this issue. He said that North Carolina has done well because of the leadership of Senator Warren and is being recognized by other States as a leader in this area. He stated that his wife had a stroke over three years ago so he is motivated to pursue this research. He stated that they have just received another \$100,000 to continue a tri-state heart summit to look at research. Dr. Ensley presented the Board with a comprehensive booklet for the State and information on Pitt County alone. Three raging diseases is heart disease, strokes and diabetes. Dr. Ensley said that Dr. Griffith Steele, neurologist is developing a stroke and vascular center to address strokes patients needs. Dr. Ensley stated that the Pitt County Public Health Center is a role model for other agencies.

Commissioner Ward thanked Senator Warren and Dr. Ensley and noted the nationwide effort which is getting a lot of attention.

Senator Warren said the long term goal is to have \$100,000 for the medical school for diabetes. He plans to have a combined stroke and diabetes center and that would give the residents a complete center. Vice Chairman Hammond noted that the citizens will not have to travel all over the State with these plans. He commended Senator Warren for his work.

Senator Warren introduced Dr. Pfeifer who heads up medical school program and authors the Diabetes Forecast. Dr. Pfeifer said that six percent of the population has diabetes but in this region seven percent has it and is grow to 1 out of 11 people. He said \$30 billion is spent on diabetes annually nationwide. He said this could be cut by \$17 billion by using the information that is currently available. The Hospital is working on some ideas. Some of those funds will be used to kickoff the wellness center. He spoke about foot ulcers in diabetics and noted that they have a radio show and a regular newsletter concerning diabetes.

### **Manager's Report - Tom Robinson**

a. Hurricane Floyd Recovery updates - FEMA and SBA deadlines have been extended to February 17<sup>th</sup>,

Mr. Robinson noted that about \$100 million in disaster housing - \$5 million; SBA loans 1452 loans at \$65 million in loans. Said the newspaper said that Pitt County is lagging behind but that his figures show the rate of returns was 51% indicating that they have incorrect information. He said that \$22 million in public assistance has been received in the County and municipalities. There is \$62 million in SBA loan applicants that are eligible. Pitt County is charged with distributing this money. There was \$16 million appropriated for people who were not approved for SBA loans. He said a lot of people have not returned their SBA applications and they are seeking ways to encourage people to apply for these funds so they may be eligible for all sources of funding. Mr. Joyner is setting up meetings with churches and other agencies.

Mr. Robinson reminded the Board of the Eastern Regional County Managers meeting on January 26<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. at the Ag Center with State officials present. He said that the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners has hired a lobbyist to work on the best way to be successful with this \$836 million package from the State. He said they are looking for a plan, in addition to a specific effort for eastern North Carolina. He said they will be seeking opportunities to get information out to citizens.

Mr. Bobby Joyner stated that he met with officials last week and he talked with the State about sending two people from FEMA to work directly with Pitt County and he anticipates putting them in the

Recovery Center. He said that he is working through the problems with the State and FEMA officials. He asked if they would also send someone from Small Business Administration to work in Pitt County and they agreed to look into the possibility. Mr. Joyner said he hoped to have all the personnel up and going by next Monday. He stated that there is a definite need to walk individuals through the process and he is committed to getting people through it. He said if the plan works like he has proposed then there will be filing access and access to the database by the County. He stated that the FEMA officials informed him that they have had problems with their computer program. Vice Chairman Hammond spoke about how FEMA people come in and tell the people one thing and then they leave and FEMA sends someone else in that tells the people something different. Mr. Joyner said they are going to meet with all agencies working on this situation to share information.

- b. Pre-budget input from public – Mr. Robinson said the County staff is asking for citizens to provide input on the County budget.
- c. National Groundhog Job Shadow Day – Student Kasey Edwards, Ayden-Grifton Shadowing Manager – February 1, 2000 - student will shadow manager all day.
- d. North Carolina Court of Appeals to hold special sessions in Pitt County on March 13 and 14, 2000 - Superior Court Judge Duke invited the North Carolina Court of Appeals to a hold session and they will be held on March 13<sup>th</sup> in Pitt County and March 14<sup>th</sup> in Farmville.

**Update on Pay and Classification Study – Tom Robinson**

Mr. Robinson said that they are doing a pay and classification study and presented the committee members names with Joel Scales acting as chairman. He said they are working with Florida Hardy and Tom Robinson to update the pay and have accurate job descriptions, consistent classification system of employees, to develop a personnel system that is equivalent to State related functions. He said he has retained the Mercer Group from Atlanta to do this and will have information in time for the budget sessions so the changes can be considered. Vice Chairman Hammond said he did not want any jobs de-valued by being contracted out. Vice Chairman Hammond said that all employees should receive the same benefits and everyone should be treated fairly if they work for Pitt County. Mr. Robinson said that Vice Chairman Hammond is referring to employees with private companies that provide contractual services to Pitt County such as meals at the Detention Center.

Mr. Robinson said he had worked with some of the firms in North Carolina and that Pitt County had not been satisfied. Mr. Joel Scales stated that the Mercer Group did have references in North Carolina and that the committee did a phone follow up with these references. He would be glad to provide them to the Board.

**Request for Support of a Homeownership Project for Pitt County Residents – Barbara Fenner, West Greenville Community Dev. Corp.**

Ms. Barbara Fenner, Executive Director of the West Greenville Community Development Corporation, and also Director of Pitt County Housing Recovery Center for North Carolina stated that she had started to speak at the last meeting but ran out of time. She said that since November 28 they have been counseling and providing outreach for flood victims. They have been explaining the process and interpret it to flood victims. She stated that the one-stop shop is going to be key for the success. Over 10,000 people have registered with FEMA in Pitt County. This request for \$50,000 has to do with property that they have that can assist with the recovery. They have the potential of five units, two-three bedroom units to sell. The two units are 95% complete but they need financial assistance to move forward. These units can be for flood victims or any resident in Pitt County that has been a Pitt County resident for a minimum of two years. The loans may be forgiven if they remain in the homes for ten years. They have been building homes for ten years, with tax values of \$50,000 to \$70,000. They have the support of the State agencies. She stated that they are asking for the County's support. The federal and state agencies want to see local support in these programs. They have three counselors on staff and are counseling over 400 people. They help people with minimum repairs. The North Carolina Rural Economic Center has been a substantial funding source for their program.

The Housing Counseling Recovery Center is pulling together all of the resources. They met with James Rhodes, Pitt County Planning Director, last week and they have agreed to rotate their counselors in and out of the Recovery Operations Center so they can help flood victims to recover within 18 to 24 months. Single family homes are provided and there are two that need to be completed. The two homes are located in the West Greenville area. Three other units are located in West Greenville but construction has not begun on these units. She stated that they would like to expand out into the County.

Commissioner Bowen asked about the size of staff and Ms. Fenner's salary. She stated that there is a staff of five and she receives a salary of \$40,000. Commissioner Ward asked if she was proposing that the focus be changed or if she was asking for the Board to allow them to expand into the County. Ms. Fenner stated that initially they are asking the County to come into the West Greenville area and then later allow them to expand into the County. Vice Chairman Hammond praised Ms. Fenner on these projects and noted that the tax value had been added to the County and City of Greenville's

taxes. Vice Chairman Hammond said that there is housing needed in Greenville, Grifton and other areas.

Vice Chairman Hammond said he wanted to go on record that the Board be supportive of the West Greenville Corporation and the \$50,000 request. Chairman Gaskins asked if anyone has talked with the City staff. Mr. Robinson said that the County has tried to stay out of the housing business, except in water and sewer lines and Community Development Block Grants. He said that they believe it is not the County's role to get in the housing business. Commissioner James said he supported the work but agreed that the County should not get in the housing business and it should stay with the private sector.

Vice Chairman Hammond said because of Hurricane Floyd, the County is in the housing business. Ms. Fenner said that the County has been involved in housing by contracting with the Wooten Company through the CDBG program. Mr. Robinson said that the recommendation from staff is to help with water and sewer lines in the County and continue with the CDBG program. He said the County's role is to work with the municipalities and deal with schools, economic development and water and sewer. Mr. Robinson said that the State was providing assistance for some of the private non-profit agencies to assist with flood recovery. Ms. Fenner said they extended a partnership to the City and County. Ms. Fenner said that they work under Mr. Bill McNeal who will be sending counselors to her office. Mr. Robinson said that the County has asked for the State to provide funding for counselors but they are using private non-profit agencies for counselors.

Mr. Rhodes said that the State employees have now evolved over to Ms. Fenner's staff, to work as housing counselors in the referral agencies. They will assist the County in directing citizens to the proper agencies. Housing counselors have been trained to know the funds available and to help lead the people to them. Mr. Rhodes said that he supports the housing counselors being brought into the Recovery Center.

Vice Chairman Hammond motioned to honor the request of \$50,000 by Ms. Fenner of the West Greenville Development Corporation. The motion did not receive a second, so the motion failed. Vice Chairman Hammond said the Board needs to rethink the priorities because this was a valid request of this Board. Commissioner James said that there are a lot people needing help and the Board should not single out one special group.

#### **Request to Proclaim second week in May as "Senior Citizens Appreciation Week" – Keith Cooper**

Mr. Keith Cooper presented the Board with a resolution for "Senior Citizens Appreciation Week". Mr. Robinson said that he asked the Clerk to amend the resolution stating that the Board was approving the resolution. Mr. Cooper reviewed how quickly the aging population was increasing and the trends of what is happening with the older citizens. There is a financial burden on the elderly because their income has decreased. Government policies are shifting from the old to the young. Poverty rates of the elderly are higher. He read the Proclamation he presented to the Clerk for the Board's approval. He asked Mr. James Williams to also speak to this matter. Mr. Williams spoke on behalf of Brookhaven Home for Senior Citizens in Ayden, said this should be approved without a second thought. Senior Citizens of the County should be appreciated. He spoke of areas where other proclamations have been approved. He said it is time to give back to the citizens of this community. Commissioner Bowen said that he appreciated Mr. Cooper bringing this resolution to the Board and asked that the Attorney read the amended resolution.

Dr. Charles Byrd, Director of Council on Aging, said he had reviewed the Proclamation and said it is a positive move. He said this resolution reaffirms the independence of the older citizens.

**UPON MOTION** by Commissioner Bowen, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, the Board voted unanimously to approve.

**State Acquisition and Relocation Funds (SARF) – James Rhodes**

Mr. Rhodes presented the State Acquisition and Relocations funds program. He stated that there were 142 homes submitted to the State for assistance to the County in buying these properties. These are Phase I applicants. There are about 100 more applications that have been received. He said all the applications have to be in to the State by the end of February. Pitt County's request is the third

largest package submitted in the State. These properties will be demolished and the property will then remain open space. Eight have already been approved and the others are being reviewed. Mr. Rhodes said they need additional funds. These funds are to assist homeowners to make sure they get into comparable housing. The State has allocated up to \$50,000 to help, but they are thinking along \$15,000 - \$30,000 per home. One-half of the 142 homes were manufactured homes. They provided draft guidelines for the program. The staff is asking for the Chairman to have authorization to sign the application.

**UPON MOTION** by Commissioner James, seconded by Commissioner Ward, the Board voted unanimously to direct staff to prepare the application to request State Acquisition and Relocation Funds and authorize the Chairman to sign the application.

Commissioner James asked how many of these people had flood insurance. Mr. Rhodes said that all of that type of information will be researched before closing on these programs. Commissioner James said the people in mobile homes need to be put in regular housing. Commissioner Ward asked how many more homeowners may come in under Phase II. Mr. Rhodes said there are approximately 100 more that will go in between now and the end of February. He said these funds help out people that were in marginal situations. Mr. Rhodes said this program is being scrutinized very carefully.

**Budget Amendments – General Governmental Funds – Melonie Bryan**

- a. \$5,000,000 – Housing Grant money from Homeowners loan by SBA
- b. \$10,000 – Contingency for staff for Housing Grant program
- c. \$359,518 – FEMA funding for costs related to Hurricane Floyd
- d. \$42,183 – Insurance proceeds for roof repairs at Ag Center

Ms. Bryan said that the \$5 million is the best estimate of the \$60 million for housing grants from SBA. This money is coming through request with the housing counselors and they will talk with the people on how this money can be used. This money can be used to pay back SBA loans. The Department of Commerce will be sending out letters notifying people of this program. The \$5 million is the first request so the county can have money on hand to begin this program. Mr. Robinson said that the State guidelines are very clear on how these funds can be used and he is concerned that people may not spend the money appropriately. He said that they have expressed their concerns to the State. Mr. Robinson said there is potential for a major problem with the way these funds are being administered. These are grants, not loans.

Vice Chairman Hammond asked that there be some type of measure put into place so this can be monitored so this will not be a problem. Commissioner James said that when FEMA funds are received, it is spelled out how it can be used.

Ms. Bryan asked for a budget amendment for \$10,000 to help staff the recovery efforts. The \$359,518 FEMA funding for costs that the County has already paid out and FEMA is reimbursing the County. The \$42,183 budget amendment is for insurance reimbursement for repairs on Agricultural Building.

**UPON MOTION** by Commissioner James, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, the Board voted unanimously to approve the budget amendments as presented.

**Approve Plaque for Courthouse Addition – Phil Dickerson**

Mr. Dickerson reported that the pews for Courthouse were lost in the flood and had to be reordered. The pews should be installed within two weeks. The county seal is being redone because the first one was broken. There is a courthouse committee meeting this week to review all the final details of the courthouse. A sample plaque was sent to the Board for review and Mr. Dickerson said he needed direction on exactly what the Board wanted to appear on the plaque.

Commissioner Bowen motioned that he supported the proposal that has all the commissioners that were on the Board in the beginning of the project in 1997 and until completion in 1999. Commissioner James seconded the motion.

Commissioner Owens said that for historical information the plaque should have the Commissioners that were on the Board when the contract was let and the Commissioners that were on it when it was completed. He said his intention in the previous motion was to have two plaques. He said he thought there should be one plaque with the courthouse committee and a second plaque was to have commissioners when the project was dedicated, not one plaque with all this information on it.

Vice Chairman Hammond called for the question. The vote was six to one. Commissioner Ward, Commissioner Johnson, Commissioner James, Vice Chairman Hammond, Chairman Gaskins, and Commissioner Bowen voted in favor of the motion. Commissioner Owens opposed the motion.

Commissioner Owens said that at a courthouse the Judges such as the Superior Court Judge, Senior Resident Court Judge, Sheriff, Architect, Contractors would be appropriate to have on a plaque.

**UPON MOTION** by Vice Chairman Hammond to include both Sheriff Vandiford and Manning, both Senior Superior Court Judges, both Clerks of Court and both-Senior District Resident Court Judges. Commissioner Bowen seconded motion. This is necessary because there are new people in these positions since the contract was first let. Commissioner James said to make a separate plaque with all the Judges and the Sheriff. Commissioner Bowen said he would like the dates including 1997 to 2000. It was stated that Judge Clifton Everette’s name should also be included. Commissioner James called the question. The vote was unanimous to approve the plaque having all the named individuals listed.

Mr. Robinson said that one of the judges had called about how his name would appear on the plaque. Mr. Dickerson reported what had been put on other plaques.

**Location of County Seal in Courthouse Lobby – Phil Dickerson**

Mr. Dickerson said that the Perkins Foundation paid for a nice seal to go in the courthouse floor. The Sheriff’s security equipment is being installed where the seal was supposed to go. He stated that there is a good chance that the seal will be relocated. He said the committee will address this matter. He stated that they will try to resolve it at the meeting on Friday.

**Request to Hire Engineering Technician – Phil Dickerson**

Mr. Dickerson said that he had requested at budget time to hire an engineering technician but held off on it for a while. He said with the flood they do not have the staff to do everything that needs to be done. He said they could work better if they had someone who could do the drafting and could work with housing and relieve some of the pressure in the building inspections. He would like to move forward to advertise and it will take six to eight weeks to fill the position. There are funds coming from the Governor's office for housing assistance. There are funds to help offset the cost of the position. Commissioner Owens stated that an in-house person could help save money.

**UPON MOTION** by Commissioner Owens, seconded by Commissioner Ward, the Board voted unanimously to authorize the hiring of an engineering technician. Mr. Dickerson said he wants to hire someone who is also trained to be a building inspector.

**Request to Hire an Internal Auditor to review County operations - Melonie Bryan**

Mr. Robinson stated that instead of hiring an internal auditor that would report to the Manager or the Finance Officer, they would like to suggest that the Board hire a firm that would come in and review the departments and report back to the Board. Ms. Bryan said that in doing research they have found that an employee has a hard time reporting on the departments and feels that the reporting should be made to the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Owens asked if this would not be like them auditing themselves. Ms. Bryan said that they would be auditing the processes differently than their annual audit that they do as required by the State.

Vice Chairman Hammond commended Ms. Bryan on the work she has done in bringing Mental Health back into a positive financial structure. He suggested that there should be several firms that this assignment is given to consider in the future.

**UPON MOTION** by Commissioner James, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, the Board voted unanimously to follow the staff's recommendation to retain Mr. Bryan Starnes, of Martin Starnes and Associates firm, to do internal auditing work for Pitt County and that the auditor will report directly to the Board of Commissioners.

Mr. Robinson said that Mr. Starnes has been working with the State on some of their procedures and he hopes improvements will be made by the State.
