

**OFFICE OF THE PITT COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
GREENVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA
FEBRUARY 21, 2000**

The Pitt County Board of Commissioners met in a regular session on Monday, February 21, 2000, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Auditorium, Pitt County Office Building, 1717 W. 5th Street, Greenville, North Carolina.

CALL TO ORDER - Chairman Gaskins

INVOCATION offered by Commissioner Bowen.

PLEDGE lead by Commissioner Johnson.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA - Chairman Gaskins

Mr. Robinson stated that item number six on the Bell Arthur Water Expansion needs to be tabled until a later date. Commissioner Bowen asked to add to the agenda the announcement of the raise to Dr. Mitchell to ratify the action taken in the last meeting. Commissioner Bowen stated this item could replace the number six item.

UPON MOTION by Vice Chairman Hammond, seconded by Commissioner James, the Board voted unanimously to approve the agenda as amended.

PUBLIC ADDRESSES TO THE BOARD

- Nancy Colville - said she was upset over Vice Chairman Hammond's action at the last meeting when he recognized a candidate for the District A vacancy. Ms. Colville also stated that she had received the West Greenville Community Development Corporation record of projects and funding. She said the Board of Commissioners were being good stewards of the public's money by not getting involved with the West Greenville Community Development Corporation. She highlighted the funding on several activities. She said Ms. Fenner should go after the contractor that walked off of a job for funds and not come to the local governments. She said it appeared that money has been mishandled. She stated that Ms. Fenner is in charge of the housing counselors and they are located in West Greenville

and nobody knows where they are or if they are qualified. She asked if Melonie Bryan will be held accountable for the buy-out program because the housing counselors are making the decisions on who is getting the money. She said that the rules were changed in Raleigh last week and the housing counselors are making those decisions. She wanted to know if they were educated on the change in rules.

- Carlton Hardee, Manager of the Vocational Rehabilitation Services office in Pitt County and a State employee said he had 28 years in his position and will be retiring May 1st after 34 years of service. He thanked the Board for allowing him to serve on the various boards. He stated he was a charter member of Work First, Workforce Development, Pitt Area Transit Board, and the Pitt County Committee for Employment of People with Disabilities. He said these are great examples of the State and local governments working together. He thanked each one the Commissioners for their support to disabled citizens of Pitt County. He offered to serve on other committees and in volunteer capacities in the future
- John Grier – Mr. Grier stated that he and Reverend Hammond were working on a project and spoke about the Supreme Court and the Ten Commandments. He discussed the Franklin Graham Crusade and where over 62,000 people attended and 3,000 people were saved. He stated that a gathering will be held on May 26 and May 27, with the purpose is to improve racial differences so there can be some healing in this community. He said there will be a 2,000 person choir. Reverend Hammond will co-chair and Reggie White, an ex-football player will be there. They have several excellent speakers coming and there will be special recognition of Veterans done as well as acknowledging people who worked with flood victims.
- Dick Adams – Mr. Adams stated that his name has appeared in the newspaper for not paying his taxes and he had received five notices since last March on a piece of property that he had sold. He stated that when the transfer of the property was made, the responsibility for the taxes was transferred to the new owner and he would like the county tax records to reflect the same. He said the continued tax notices and his name appearing in the paper was a form of harassment. He encouraged the Board to do something to correct this situation.
- Mr. Robinson said a representative from Sycamore Hills Baptist Church had called him last night at home and asked if someone from their church could speak today. He asked if anyone was present to speak. Commissioner James discouraged opening the floor to speakers that were not present and had not signed up to speak.

Ms. Ann Huggins presented the Board with a letter from Dr. Howard Parker, Jr. concerning her possible appointment to the Board.

Manager's Report

Mr. Robinson reported on

- Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Grant to help with flood recovery activities.
- Hurricane Floyd Recovery Center - Mr. Rhodes spoke on the success of the one-stop shop in the Recovery Operations Center. He stated about forty people per day were coming into the center. The housing counselors are there three days per week. FEMA and SBA representatives are available. They are all on the same campus so it is more convenient. The City of Greenville did get a portion of their program. They took a different approach than the County and they are going to Raleigh tomorrow. The County has submitted 168 properties and he showed the Board where most of those properties were located on the Tar River, Contentnea Creek and other scattered sites. The County has requested \$15 million for the Buy-out program and Relocation services, appraisals, and other services. He stated he hoped to hear something within the next three weeks. Other matters to consider are infrastructure assistance which allows developers to help with extending water lines. There are rental assistance, rehabilitation projects and repair programs available. He stated that if

the people do not go through the SBA process, the County does not know what to do with the applications. Mr. Rhodes said that the housing counselor has done a great job but they need more assistance. Commissioner James asked if Mr. Rhodes had gotten a response to his letter for additional assistance. Mr. Rhodes said Ms. Fenner has indicated that she could not provide additional assistance and he has requested assistance from the State.

Commissioner James mentioned that there are some individuals who need assistance in Penny Hill. Vice Chairman Hammond said he had spoken with Ms. Fenner and that many people had visited their offices. He said that Ms. Fenner's staff have been very helpful in assisting citizens with filling out applications. Commissioner Bowen said that he understood that people were supposed to work at the Recovery Operations Center but did not show up. He asked if the people got paid whether they worked or not. Mr. Robinson said that some of the State officials will be in Greenville today and Wednesday for meetings. Commissioner Shank said that the County does not have the authority to get the additional personnel and would be glad for commissioners to provide any assistance in acquiring the additional staff. Commissioner Bowen asked for Mr. Rhodes to explain the relationship between the County and the West Greenville Development Corporation. Mr. Rhodes explained the relationship stating that they are providing staff for three days a week but there is a need for at least one full-time counselor. He said the County needs additional personnel. There have been a lot of new programs initiated that have caused the need for the additional counselors.

Commissioner Ward said that the first time Ms. Fenner spoke to the Board she was offering a full-time person. Mr. Rhodes said that since Ms. Fenner has not been able to provide additional personnel he will be appealing to the State for assistance.

Commissioner James **motioned** to request from the State that additional counselors be sent to Pitt County to help the flood victims with obtaining loans from SBA and FEMA to work in the County Recovery Operations Center and that it be done immediately. Commissioner Bowen seconded the motion.

Vice Chairman Hammond said that Ms. Fenner held a meeting at the Agricultural Building that some 200 people attended that needed help with their applications and he stated that the County should thank her for her efforts in this area. Commissioner Owens asked that the staff provide a review of tax losses to the Board from Hurricane Floyd and its flooding.

The **motion** passed unanimously.

Mr. Robinson announced that the County received \$314,030 in housing recovery grants.

Mr. Robinson reviewed the following Budget Priorities for FY 2000-2001 as expressed previously by the Board.

 - Implement Community Recovery Plan
- Purchase land and develop Phase I Firing Range and Defensive Driving Range
- Develop a Hazard Mitigation Plan to reduce future damage from flooding
- Seek site and purchase land for large County park and Intergenerational Center
- Form a task force and develop strategies to reduce poverty within County
- Work with Community College to refine capital needs and develop a funding plan for highest priorities
- Work to achieve education compact objectives
- Work with new Mental Health Director to continue to strengthen area program

Vice Chairman Hammond asked if Hurricane Floyd requests would alter these requests. Mr. Robinson said that he did not believe so and that in some areas the tax rate is rebounding better than it was prior to the flood. The County should recover nicely from the storm. Commissioner James said that recreation in the temporary mobile home parks should be considered a priority.

Mr. Robinson reported that the County would be hosting an Eastern Regional Manager's meeting on Wednesday, February 25, 2000 with representatives from the Governor's office attending to discuss the recovery plans. He stated the Managers and others will be looking at lobbying efforts for Washington, D.C. Mr. Al Delia will be there to work on a Marshall Plan for eastern North Carolina.

Mr. Robinson reminded the Board that the National Legislative Conference will be held March 3 - 7, 2000 and Commissioner Shank, Vice Chairman Hammond, Commissioner Bowen, Tom Robinson, and JoAnne Burgdorff will be in attendance. He also informed the Board of the NCACC District Meeting on March 13th in Williamston.

Mr. Robinson said Mr. Dickerson had informed him that Pitt County was eligible for two grants for ECVC recycling efforts with a required 10% match which would be provided by Eastern Carolina Vocational Center.

Mr. Robinson said that the County needed to request to extension to FEMA's deadline of March 15th for debris removal.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner James, seconded by Commissioner Shank, the Board voted unanimously to adopt a motion to request an extension to the FEMA deadline of March 15th for debris removal from Hurricane Floyd.

Mr. Robinson informed the Board that staff was preparing for a Rating Agency visit in New York that would be done later next month. He said he hoped to get an upgrade in bond ratings for the County. He stated attending would be representatives from the Schools, Development Commission, Manager, Attorney, and Finance. Commissioner Shank asked if there should be representation from the Board? Mr. Robinson said staff is ready to make those presentations. Commissioner Owens agreed with Commissioner Shank that the Board should have representation. Vice Chairman Hammond, Commissioner Shank, Commissioner Owens volunteered to go to New York for the rating agency meeting. Chairman Gaskins assigned Commissioner Owens as the Board's representative for the Rating Agency trip.

Monthly Financial Report

Mr. Robinson stated that Ms. Melonie Bryan, Director of Financial Services was out with a sick child and suggested delaying her finance report until the following Board meeting.

Commissioner Owens asked to move up the Humber House Renovations to accommodate the visitors representing the Humber House.

Humber House Renovations - Scott Power, David Brook, and Judge John B. Lewis

Mr. Power stated he had provided the Board with a package of detailed information on the Humber House. He said that the Eastern Regional Division of Archives and History office was located in the Humber House, which included eight full-time positions. Mr. Power said that in the past representatives from the City and the County requested that the House be preserved. The property was leased in 1981 to the Division of Archives. The maintenance has been split between the City and County and he stated they would like to change that arrangement for a better working arrangement.

Mr. David Brook, Administrator of State Preservations Office, spoke about their purpose. They need to maintain a presence in eastern North Carolina and they serve twenty-three counties in North Carolina. He said that for almost twenty years, they have been working with locals on architectural surveys. The Pitt County Book won a national award. There are properties on the National registered and some received nominations including some in

Farmville, Ayden and Winterville. He said that the Humber House helps to keep the area culturally enriched. The State and Federal governments provided projects in the amount of \$2.5 million. Their budget runs to \$200,000 to \$250,000 per year. He spoke about Robert Lee Humber as an individual and how the family wished for the house to be maintained as a historical site. He thanked the Board for their assistance in preserving the heritage of this State.

Mr. Power stated that they have also made a presentation to the City Council. He said the exterior of the house has deteriorated tremendously. Vice Chairman Hammond asked how much it cost annually to maintain the house. There is \$3,000 annually budgeted by the City and County. He asked why it had deteriorated so badly. Mr. Power said that they have requested work annually. He said he thought they had approximately \$75,000 for exterior repairs needed and with the substantial flooding in the basement they have a request for FEMA for \$35,000 for those repairs. He stated that they have a total of approximately \$150,000 of work needed on the house. The outside needs painting but it will require a lot of preparation prior to painting. The front porch needs repair, windows upstairs need replacement and several other areas need work.

Mr. Robinson said that the Division of Archives and History have not been paying market rent so the County and City have had to undertake the expensive of keeping the house maintained. He said Mr. Power has noted that they are not paying market rent but would be willing to reconsider the rent arrangement. Mr. Power said that he hoped the Board would look at the significance of this historical home. Commissioner Shank said she would like the Board to receive a copy of the agreement for maintenance. Mr. Power said there is not a written agreement. The State pays for janitorial services, yard maintenance, and utilities in the house.

Judge John B. Lewis spoke to the Board about the value of this house and stated that the house is an asset. This house was given to the City and County with conditions. The building is a splendid house for Pitt County and was built as a tribute to Dr. Humber who was a scholar. It reaches outside of Pitt County into eastern North Carolina. The Eight full time positions that are housed in this house are also an asset. This house is a treasure for Pitt County. He said he asked the Board to keep this house as a treasure. Vice Chairman Hammond suggested that a formal agreement be put into place.

Monthly Tax Collections Report - Floyd Little

Commissioner Bowen asked if there could be a change in the process that Mr. Dick Adams had complained about where he had sold the property but the taxes on the property still showed up on Mr. Adams tax bill. Mr. Little reported he had sent notices to the new owner and previous owner. Commissioner James said the attorneys are being paid to make sure this is done right.

Chairman Gaskins called for a ten-minute break at 10:25 a.m.

ITEMS FOR DECISION

Architectural Contract for new Administration Building - Phil Dickerson

Mr. Dickerson stated that there has been discussion about constructing a new building for County Administration on a separate site from the existing building. He said the departments in the current County Office Building are running out of space. There are no meeting rooms available any more. John K. Farcas, Architect, has worked with the County as part of the East Group on other projects.

Mr. Dickerson recommended the County exempt itself from the qualification based criteria for the new Administration Building project and asked the Board to authorize the Chairman to execute a contract with John K. Farkas, AIA for the design of the new building.

Commissioner Owens said he had a problem with building an Administrative Building as a priority before G. R. Whitfield School, Pactolus School and Pitt Community College projects are begun. Mr. Robinson said that this Board had approved \$48 million for improvements for the Schools and those items are in the current financing process. He stated that there is a need for the Department of Social Services to have additional space. This space would be created by moving the administrative staff out of the County Office Building. He stated that there is a continued effort to work with the Community College on their building projects but the County is looking for major funding from the State to be coming forward on their projects. Commissioner James said he agreed that these initiatives are appropriate but the County needs to be on sound ground financially. He said the priorities Commissioner Owens' spoke about need to be moved ahead of consideration of building a new administration building. He also stated that the recreation facility should be looked into first. Commissioner Owens said that this contract would come before the schools and that was why he was opposed to the building.

Commissioner Owens **motioned** to table the contract with John Farkas, Architect and it was seconded by Commissioner James. Commissioner Shank said the funding for the schools has already been established as a priority. She said the Department of Social Services is running out of space and we are not doing justice if the Board does not move forward on this matter. Commissioner Ward said that the school projects have already been approved by this Board so they can move on with the building plans. She stated she wanted to move forward on this project. Commissioner Shank said she is the Social Services board member and this project is badly needed. The vote was as follows: Commissioner James, Commissioner Owens, Vice Chairman Hammond, Chairman Gaskins, and Commissioner Bowen were in favor of the motion. Commissioner Johnson, Commissioner Ward and Commissioner Shank were opposed to the motion.

New Sound System for Agricultural Center Auditorium - Phil Dickerson

Mr. Robinson stated that there is a need for a new sound system at the Agricultural Center Auditorium. Mr. Dickerson said that they are preparing to put new carpet in the auditorium at the Agricultural Building but some wiring needs to be done prior to putting the carpet down. He stated Mr. Holt and Mr. Smith worked together on the proposals for a new sound system and had agreed to recommend the work be awarded to Blue House Studio and Sound of Greenville, N.C. at a cost of \$18,265.80. These funds would have to come from the contingency fund.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner Bowen, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, the Board voted unanimously to approve the staff recommendation of awarding the work to Blue

House Studio and Sound of Greenville, N.C. at a cost of \$18,265.80 with the funds coming from the contingency fund.

Construction of Median Crossover on NC 11 - John Chaffee

Mr. Chaffee said he was requesting the use of County funds for the Worthington Industrial Park, located south of Ayden and north of Grifton. There are three small companies that are considering expansion in this area. The Elliott Dixon Drive needs a median crossover lane with two turn lanes especially for large trucks. He said they are proposing using approximately \$35,000 from the Development Commission along with additional funding from the State. The funds have been budgeted in the project funds. There could possibly be forty new good paying jobs coming for the expansion of these companies.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner Bowen, seconded by Commissioner James, to approve this request to appropriate up to \$35,000 from Development Commission project funds, to pay approximately one-half the cost of this road improvement with the expectation that NCDOT and other sources will contribute the balance. Discussion pursued. Vice Chairman Hammond called the question. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Chaffee stated that the Research Triangle Institute will announce that they will be expanding to the Greenville area. They will employ about 90 people for a research lab facility. They do public and private work and will create part-time and full-time positions. They will also use ECU and Pitt Community College students. He stated he hoped to bring some additional good news to the Board soon.

Commissioner James said there is a great deal of traffic coming out on NC Highways 11 and 13 and it is causing some problems. He said he would like the North Carolina Department of Transportation to look at putting an on/off ramp for Old River Road. He said the County caused the problem with the road when it was closed down. Commissioner James asked Mr. Chaffee to pursue that objective. Vice Chairman Hammond said the expansion of the airport is what caused the problem.

Presentation on Intergenerational Center and Park - Alice Keene

Ms. Keene introduced some of the supporters that were present. She reviewed the Pitt County Community Schools mission. There were five recommendations that were previously approved by the Board. She noted the need for a home for the Community Schools Program which includes office space and space for recreation activities. She recommended an intergenerational center and park. Ms. Keene cited the increased participation in youth programs as well as senior programs. The senior programs go on all year. She said some gyms are being used all weekend and during after school periods. Ms. Keene provided information about quality family programs and the value of these programs for children.

In support of the Center and Park she noted the following:

Statically based telephone survey

- 77% households participated in recreation
- 74.2% Nature and outdoor activities
- 75% think PCCS& R activities should be increased
- 87.2% said Pitt County should provide recreation and park facilities
- 89.2% support the use of county taxes for recreation and parks

Recommendations from the Recreation Master Plan

- continue & expand current programs

- recommended additional recreation centers
- recommended additional acres for neighborhood, community and county/regional parks
- more resource-based recreation opportunities

County Park would include:

- softball fields
- multi-purpose sports fields (soccer)
- playground
- picnic facilities
- trails for walking and jogging
- restrooms

Intergenerational Recreation Center would include:

- Intergenerational - Designed to Serve Citizens of all Ages
- Offices
- Gymnasium
- Multipurpose rooms
 - ⇒ Exercise
 - ⇒ Arts and Crafts
 - ⇒ Dance
 - ⇒ Meetings
 - ⇒ Civic Activities (Scouts, 4-H, etc.)
 - ⇒ Concessions
 - ⇒ Storage

Ms. Keene said that they believe that building an Intergenerational Center will give the Community Schools program the opportunity to play a key role in building and maintaining healthy lifestyles for all citizens from youth to senior citizens.

- Local appropriation
- Parks and Recreation Trust Fund (PARTF)
- Foundations
- Business or Civic Club Sponsorship
- Donors
- Land and Water Conservation Fund

Proposed actions:

- Approve Intergenerational Center concept

- Incorporate into capital improvement plan
- Authority to incorporate recreation and parks on buy-out properties

Commissioner Bowen asked if the YMCA has ever considered coming to Pitt County. Ms. Keene said that she knew they had considered it but could not get enough interest. Commissioner Bowen spoke of the ballgame schedule.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner James, seconded by Commissioner Shank, to approve the recommendations to approve the Intergenerational Center concept plan; authorization to develop a cost estimate and finance plan; and to identify a possible location(s) for the facility. Commissioner Shank seconded the motion. Vice Chairman Hammond asked about Jacksonville's recreation program that Ms. Keene had earlier mentioned. She stated they

have a large parcel of land, and they have a senior center, gymnasium and other facilities. They have two schools being worked on in the same area and in the future they are building a convention center on the same site. Vice Chairman Hammond asked if she was suggesting buying one tract of land, or several sites. She stated it would take 24.5 acres for the plan she presented. Commissioner Owens asked about square footage they currently have and what she is recommending in this plan. He also asked about the programs in different communities. Commissioner Owens said that if you go for centralization you may lose the community schools concept. Ms. Keene said that she wanted to assure that they are not working to minimize their relationships with the schools but just need to have additional space for programs.

Commissioner James said that the Belvoir program has more students than any other program and they do not even have a gym. He said they have had money appropriated for five years and still have not built a school. Vice Chairman Hammond said he wanted to consider the facility being as centralized as possible. Commissioner James was opposed to this because they need to continue the community programs. Commissioner Ward said all the same programs will continue and this is in addition to those programs.

Mr. Robinson said that she may need some assistance in the cost estimate. Ms. Keene said she planned to use county resources.

The **motion** passed unanimously. Commissioner Bowen spoke on what a wonderful job Ms. Keene has done. Ms. Keene spoke about her wonderful staff and introduced Sherry Williams, Kim Bolen-Terry, Dwane Cooper, Rita Roy, and Jeanne Long. She said that this is a unique program and she said she has had a wonderful working relationship and praised the commissioners.

Resolution on Land and Water Conservation - Alice Keene

Ms. Keene asked the Board support in moving forward with asking the State to re-institute Land and Water Conservation Fund.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner James, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, the board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution Supporting Funding for the Land and Water Conservation Fund or Similar Programs.

Resolution Supporting Funding for the Land and Water Conservation Fund or Similar Programs

WHEREAS, for over 30 years, the Land and Water Conservation Fund was a legacy left behind by the Outdoor Recreation Review Commission of the Federal Government to assist in funding, specifically for the purpose of acquiring and developing natural resources that would provide recreational opportunities and preservation of open space for future generations; and

WHEREAS, Land and Water Conservation Funds were generated from revenues produced from the sale of the country's natural resources, specifically off-shore drilling rights; and

WHEREAS, the need to preserve open spaces and develop and maintain national, state, and local parks and recreational facilities by ever increasing populations; and

WHEREAS, during the last session of Congress, both the House and the Senate introduced Bills which would reinstate funding for Land and Water Conservation Fund or similar programs; and

WHEREAS, Pitt County has identified tremendous needed improvements for parks and recreation facilities, including renovation to existing facilities, development of new facilities, development of greenways, and protection and acquisition of open space, with funding for these projects limited from local sources; and

WHEREAS, reinstatement for funding for the Land and Water Conservation Fund or similar programs would greatly benefit Pitt County as it develops and renovates recreational facilities for future generations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PITT COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS THAT:

1. Pitt County urges members of the House of Representatives and Senate of the United States congress to support reinstating the funding for the Land and Water Conservation fund or similar programs which would greatly benefit both state and local governments as they strive to meet the continual needs of recreational services for their citizens.
2. A copy of this resolution shall be sent to the U.S. House of Representatives for Congressional Districts 1 and 3 and to both U.S. Senators who represent North Carolina.

Administrative Order for Courthouse Security - JoAnne Burgdorff

Ms. Burgdorff stated that she had received a request from Judge David Leech for an Administrative Order for Courthouse Security and after reviewing it, it became apparent that this was a good idea. It would reduce the County's liability, as the judges have judicial immunity. She provided the Board with an Administrative Order for Courthouse Security and a copy of the request from the judges that the Board request that they issue this order.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner Shank, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, to authorize the Administrative Order for Courthouse Security be issued by the Senior Resident Superior Court Judge and the Chief District Court Judge.

Commissioner Bowen asked for a brief description of this Administrative Order. Ms. Burgdorff explained that the order means the Judges can order the Sheriff or his designees, to advise everyone entering the courthouse that they are subject to being searched and their packages may be scanned for weapons. This enables them to use a security device which helps with protection of witnesses, judges, and the general public. We will be required to put up notices in the building. She said they have already arranged for a private company to provide the security services and it may already be installed. Commissioner James called for the question. The motion passed unanimously.

Appointment of Commissioner to HealthEast Subsidiary Board - Susan Banks

Commissioner James nominated Commissioner Shank to serve on the HealthEast Subsidiary Board and it was seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond. The Board voted unanimously to approve Commissioner Shank's appointment.

Appointment of Planning Board Member, District B - Susan Banks

Commissioner Johnson motioned to appoint Lyman Hardee to fill the vacancy on the Pitt County Planning Board. Vice Chairman Hammond seconded the motion and the Board voted unanimously in approval.

Commissioners Reports and Comments

Commissioner Owens acknowledged Judy Royal's last day as the Board's designated reporter from *The Daily Reflector*. Ms. Royal will be moving to Wilmington.

Commissioner James said that he was requesting the County Attorney to provide the Board with an update on the funds received on overtime pay from FEMA. He said he wanted to make sure the County does get reimbursed on the overtime pay and report to the Board. He asked that she verify what has been paid from FEMA to the County of Pitt for overtime pay.

Vice Chairman Hammond reported that several commissioners and the Manager attended a workshop in Chapel Hill on how to establish better relationships as a governing board. He said the Institute of Government provides a large range of services for elected and appointed officials to use in their jobs. He said the Manager has assured them that FEMA is going to reimburse Pitt County for expenditures for overtime pay incurred during the flood but there appears to be mixed signals from FEMA officials. He asked that the Manager get the appropriate FEMA officials to come before the Board and report on this item.

Closed Session

Ms. Burgdorff cited NC General Statute 143-318.11(a)(1) and (3) to prevent the disclosure of privileged information and to protect the attorney-client privilege to authorize the Board of Commissioners to go into closed session.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner James, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, the Board voted unanimously to go into closed session as cited by the County Attorney.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner James, seconded by Commissioner Shank, the Board voted unanimously to return to open session.

Mr. Bobby Joyner said that he had met with the State representatives concerning the need for additional housing counselors and Ms. Barbara Fenner's program. He said that she will begin providing one person on the Recovery Operations Center all day on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner James, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, the Board voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 12:50 p.m.
