helps seniors pay for prescription drugs. Mr. Cooper has a proposal for the Board to help pay for senior citizens prescription drugs.

- Vernon Morrison - spoke on how his district was modified to take in Lake Ellsworth and Red Oak areas. He spoke about the new member coming on the Board and wants information on his credentials. He said he called the food bank about the food going to the Phillipi Church. He said this was an unfair practice and somebody ought to stand up about this situation. He suggested the Board members call the food bank and check into it. He spoke about some property on the Pactolus Highway with 96 acres included that had been sold.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner Ward, seconded by Commissioner James, the Board voted unanimously to reappoint Wayne Avery as a regular member and Claudie McLawhorn was reappointed as the alternate member to the Winterville Board of Adjustment.

Appointments to Pitt County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council – Susan Banks

Commissioner Johnson motioned, seconded by Vice Chairman Hammond, for the Board to follow the recommendation of Brian Stewart, Chairman of the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council regarding appointments. Commissioner James called for the question. The Board voted unanimously to appoint Clark Everette and Nancy Pierson to the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council.

Inter-local Agreement with Town of Grimesland – James Rhodes

Mr. Rhodes stated Mayor Little and Allan Hahn, Attorney were present. Mr. Rhodes stated that Grimesland had extended their extraterritorial jurisdiction about a year ago. Ordinances that the County had in that area no longer apply including subdivision regulations. He stated that the County administers these regulations and soil erosion and sedimentation control regulations. He stated there are areas that need the regulation enforcement. Mayor Little asked that the County re-enter into a contract to administer the Subdivision and Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Ordinance. Mr. Hahn stated he drew the interlocal agreements up and they are patterned after the Town of Falkland and Simpson. They are

working on extending the sewer which was the reason for the extraterritorial jurisdiction. Commissioner James asked Mr. Rhodes if they could administer this without any problems. Mr. Rhodes said that the town would have oversight. There is a six months notice in the Agreement.

Housing Recovery Strategy – James Rhodes

He said they provided valuable insight for the County. The strategy that they worked on must be submitted to the State by July 1, 2000. They are taking advantage of all programs available. They are making sure that housing is being built back in the proper manner. The committee recommended that the Board adopt this strategy. Vice Chairman Hammond questioned Mr. Rhodes about a property. Mr. Rhodes said he had heard that the official word should be forthcoming on the awarding of the FEMA money. He stated that FEMA is still doing their review and entering it in the computer. The people who qualify are already prepared. Commissioner Shank suggested that the Board ask the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners to convey the County's major concern and request for immediate help. Vice Chairman Hammond said the Board had already done that when the Board went to Raleigh and met with the NCACC.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner Ward, seconded by Commissioner Shank, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the recommended Housing Recovery strategy.

PITT COUNTY FLOOD RECOVERY EFFORTS

(as of June 8, 2000)

Introduction

The following narrative is intended to provide additional background information on property damage in Pitt County resulting from Hurricane Floyd and the County's ongoing flood recovery efforts. This document will be continuously updated to reflect new programs and to report on the implementation of those programs for which funding has been awarded.

Event

In preparation of the landfall of Hurricane Floyd, the Pitt County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was activated on September 14, 1999. County staff assisted with the dissemination of information on road closings, shelter openings and hurricane location to the public and volunteers. On September 15, 1999, Hurricane Floyd struck Pitt County with winds in excess of 80 mph and with rainfall amounts exceeding 14 inches. Flash flooding occurred along many small tributaries during and immediately following the storm event. The EOC, staffed with County employees and volunteers, remained fully operational during the next eleven days to coordinate emergency response and associated activities as the Tar River and large creeks continued to overflow their banks.

Post Event

Preliminary Inspections

On September 25, 1999, the Pitt County Inspections Department staff and other qualified individuals canvassed unincorporated Pitt County to conduct preliminary inspections of structures damaged by flood waters. Over 20,000 structures were inspected. The inspectors distributed packets of information for clean-up procedures, precautions to take when returning to the structure, and condemnation procedures. These preliminary inspections classified flood-damaged structures into two categories – those that were repairable and those that were not. If the structure was deemed repairable, the structure could not be inhabited until the structure met requirements of the North Carolina building code. If the structure was identified as “destroyed”, the structure was determined irreparable and recommended to be demolished. Pitt County Planning Department provided maps for the inspectors and the Environmental Health Division supplied manpower to input the information gathered during these inspections. The data mapped by Planning staff were used to identify the structures and geographic areas in Pitt County affected by the flood event. This information also showed areas canvassed by the inspectors and the structures that were deemed condemned.

Damage Reports

Once the waters receded, Pitt County requested the assistance from the Professional Engineers of North Carolina (PENC) to conduct damage assessments of the flood-damaged structures. Over 20 volunteers assisted with these inspections in unincorporated Pitt County. The engineers, architects and surveyors began canvassing the County on October 15, 1999. Damage assessment worksheets provided by the North Carolina Department of Emergency Management were used to document the amount of damage and height of flood water in each structure. With this field information, the Pitt County Planning Department utilized Rapid Assessments Worksheets for manufactured homes and the Residential Substantial Damage Estimator Program for site-built homes to determine the amount of damage to each structure (i.e. percent damage) based on the property's adjusted tax value.

Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)

As the damage assessors inspected each structure, information about the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) was distributed. To further ensure that citizens were aware of the HMGP, the Planning Department staff worked with Management Information Systems (MIS) staff to send a mass mailing to property owners with flood-damage structures located in the 100 year flood plain. The Pitt County Planning Department has been accepting HMGP applications since October 15, 1999.

On November 29, 2000, the Recovery Operations Center (ROC) was established. The center is located adjacent to the Pitt County Development Services & Administrative Buildings. The center was established to serve as a central location for flood victims to receive assistance with recovery. Housing Counselors, Pitt County Legal staff, Pitt County Planning Staff, and Demolition Coordinators are located in the ROC. The ROC will continue to remain open for at least two years.

On January 18, 2000, the Pitt County Planning Department submitted its initial HMGP application to the NCDDEM. The application included 142 residential properties meeting the State's Phase I criteria. Phase I criteria included primary residences located in the 100 year flood plain and were substantially damaged (50% or greater), or received more than 5 feet of water above the first floor. Properties contiguous to eligible properties also qualified.

Pitt County submitted two additional Phase I applications on February 1, 2000, and February 28, 2000. Review of the applications continue by the North Carolina Department of Emergency Management and Federal Emergency Management Agency. On April 2000, the State tentatively approved 184 properties for acquisition from the first three applications with a budget of \$19,400,555. However, on May 24th five properties with an estimated market values exceeding \$300,000 were removed because of funding restrictions. An additional property with five structures was also removed by FEMA due to environmental concerns. As of June 7, 2000, 174 properties remain under Phase I review by FEMA with a budget of \$16.9 million. An additional 22 properties were submitted for Phase II of the HMGP in a separate application on February 29, 2000. Three properties were found ineligible for Phase II and the remaining 19 are still under the State's review process.

State Acquisition Relocation Fund(SARF)

As the review process for the HMGP has continued, the State has approved State Acquisition and Relocation Funds (SARF) for Pitt County in the amount of \$3.9 million. These funds are used in conjunction with the HMGP for the cost differential between the pre-flood fair market value of the home being purchased under the HMGP and the cost of a comparable replacement home. These monies cannot be utilized until the HMGP has been approved by FEMA.

Low-Income Repair and Replacement Housing Programs

Those individuals that do not qualify for the HMGP and the Small Business Administration (SBA) loan, may qualify for a repair or replacement housing grant. These grants are targeted for low-income home owners with the goal of providing safe, decent and sanitary housing. Over 1.3 million in repair funds were awarded on May 22, 2000, for at least 82 homes. On May 23, 2000, Pitt County received \$5.1 million for up to 72 replacement homes. Potential qualifiers were identified using the Pitt County Planning Department database. State-appointed housing counselors must determine eligibility requirements for prospective qualifiers as they meet one-on-one with each applicant.

Infrastructure for New Neighborhoods

The North Carolina Division of Community Assistance will provide for infrastructure construction for new subdivisions in an effort to provide new building lots for families displaced by the flood. Pitt County is seeking developers that can meet these requirements. The County will apply for these funds under the rural subdivision option section of the Housing Assistance Guidelines as needed.

Commissioner Shank **motioned** for the Chairman and County Manager send a letter to the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners requesting lobbying aid on behalf of the County for assistance in obtaining the flood relief funds. Commissioner James seconded the motion and the Board voted unanimously to approve the motion. Commissioner Ward stated that the County is to implement the plans for housing recovery once the funds are received.

Selection of Equity and Fixed Income Fund Managers – Tom Robinson and Walter Jones

Mr. Robinson stated that Mr. Jones, Ms. Bryan and he have met on the recommendations for the investment companies. Mr. Jones stated he had done reference checks on the companies being recommended. He stated that they sent request for proposals to forty firms and received responses from twenty-four companies including thirty-seven separate proposals to review. He said they then met with the Board and reduced the number to five proposals on equity investment firms and five on fixed investment firms. Mr. Jones met with the Manager and the Finance Officer and they recommended three investment managers with \$15 million on the equity investments and two firms of \$15 million on the fixed investments. He stated that they could measure their performance against the S&P Index, excluding the non-compliance investments, and also measure against the State investments that meet the same criteria. The following firms were recommended by Mr. Jones, Mr. Robinson and Ms. Bryan.

Equity Investments

Trusco Capital
Franklin Street Partners
Sovereign Asset Management

Fixed Investment Firms

Wachovia Asset Management
Tattersall Advisory Group

He stated that restrictions are not as stringent on the equity investments and benchmarks are more readily available. He stated that the US Treasury and Lehman Intermediate Bond Index could be used for measuring benchmarks on the equity investments.

Commissioner Owens thanked Mr. Jones, Tom Robinson and Melonie Bryan for their work on this project. Commissioner Owens said he still believed that there are local companies that could have served the County in this role.

Commissioner Owens **motioned** to follow the recommendation to go with Trusco Capital, Franklin Street Partners, and Sovereign Asset Management for the equity investments. Commissioner James seconded the motion.

Vice Chairman Hammond stated he supported the equity recommendations but has a problem on the fixed recommendations. Commissioner Ward asked why they were recommending three on the equity side. Mr. Jones said each manager has a different style and there is an advantage to using more managers because it broadens the base and somewhat reduces the risk. Commissioner Shank asked if each company in the equity investments would have \$5 million to invest. Mr. Jones stated that was the plan. She stated that she was concerned because Sovereign had not worked with any other municipalities. Mr. Jones said they had worked with a number of foundations and they understand the guidelines on these investments. Commissioner James expressed his support on the recommendations. Mr. Jones said he had not talked with anyone about their fees at this time. The Board voted unanimously to approve the recommendation for the equity investments.

Commissioner Owens **motioned** to use Wachovia and MDL Capital Management for the fixed investments. Vice Chairman Hammond seconded the motion.

Commissioner James said the Board should go with the best firm no matter who they are. He stated that Mr. Jones was hired for his expertise and the Board should depend on it. He asked Mr. Jones to explain why he chose Wachovia and Tattersall. Mr. Jones stated that they looked at a number of different criteria. Wachovia and Tattersall had prepared a portfolio of what the County's investments should look like and they were the most consistent with what the County could invest in, as well as the number of years in the business. Commissioner Owens said that he did not follow the recommendation on Tattersall because the last two years they were heavy in bonds and there was a twenty-year phase where bonds were not producing as well and these investments should have been reduced. He said he liked the other company, MDL, better and that was the basis of his recommendation. Mr. Robinson said the proposal by MDL was not laid out as well. They never identified who would be in charge of the County's investments. He said that gentleman that was present with Mr. Lay was not employed by the firm. He said that they appeared to be a riskier group than the others based on the materials and information provided. Ms. Bryan said that she was unaware that Mr. McCaskill would be present and that their proposal was considered a joint proposal. She stated that they had ruled out all other joint proposals. Vice Chairman Hammond said that MDL had one of the best client lists of all the presentations. They had out performed everyone else in the past three years. They are a minority company and they were managing more municipalities' funds than any of the others. He said they made a very positive proposal. Commissioner Johnson said he supported the staff recommendations.

Commissioner James offered a **substitute motion** to adopt the recommendation by the staff and Mr. Jones to hire with Wachovia and Tattersall for the fixed investment managers. Commissioner Shank seconded the motion. Commissioner Bowen asked about the lady that was part of the MDL presentation. She was part of MDL but there was still a question about Mr. McCaskill. Mr. McCaskill's firm is on retainer for MDL and provides marketing services for their agency. Mr. Jones said that this was a gray area and they had eliminated other proposals because they were joint proposals. Mr. McCaskill does have a separate company. Commissioner Huggins asked if the risk is as high on the fixed income as the equity side. Mr. Jones said he would not think so because if you hold your bonds you get your money back with interest.

Commissioner Ward said that once they come back and report to the Board, if things are not going well, the County can make changes anytime. Commissioner Ward called for the question.

Chairman Gaskins stated that this vote was on the substitute motion for recommendation of Wachovia Asset Management and Tattersall. The substitute motion passed with a vote of eight to one. Vice Chairman Hammond opposed the motion.

Global Transpark Commission Resolution – JoAnne Burgdorff

Mr. Robinson stated that the County has already sent a letter to the Global Transpark Commission in support of establishing a \$200,000 line of credit but that the Global Transpark would like it in the form of a resolution.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner Owens, seconded by Commissioner Shank, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the resolution supporting the \$200,000 line of credit with the Global Transpark.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PITT COUNTY

WHEREAS, Pitt County is within the Global Transpark Development Zone as established by N.C.G.S. 158-30 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, Pitt County is the beneficial owner of a certain share of the trust funds collected within the Global Transpark Development Zone and administered by the Global Transpark Development Commission; and

WHEREAS, Pitt County has applied or may hereafter apply to the Global Transpark Development Commission for a loan in the form of a line of credit from said trust funds in the amount of up to Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for one or more economic development projects within the territorial jurisdiction of the Zone; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of the aforesaid line of credit has been approved by the Global Transpark Development Commission in accordance with its Loan Policy and Procedure, with the terms of repayment as set forth in the Intergovernmental Agency Agreement and Contract and the Promissory Note required by the Global Transpark Development Commission to be executed prior to the time of disbursement of funds from the line of credit; and

WHEREAS, the funds advanced to the County from the line of credit will be utilized only for those economic development purposes set forth in N.C.G.S. 158-30 *et seq.* And in N.C.G.S. 158-7.1, and the County will comply with all public hearing and disbursement processes required by N.C.G.S. 158-7.1 and will provide adequate certification of such compliance upon request of the Commission's general counsel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PITT COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS THAT:

1. The Pitt County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes and requests that the Global Transpark Development Commission establish a line of credit for the benefit of the County in the amount of up to Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00);
2. The County shall enter into the Intergovernmental Agency Agreement and Contract with the Global Transpark Development Zone and the appropriate officers of the County shall execute the Intergovernmental Agency Agreement and Contract, Promissory Note and related documents required by the Global Transpark Development Commission prior to the time of requesting disbursement of funds to the County from the line of credit; and
3. This resolution shall be effective until specifically rescinded and notice thereof is delivered to and received by the Global Transpark Development Commission.

Resolution Delaying Congressional Action of Internet Tax Moratorium – JoAnne Burgdorff

Ms. Burgdorff provided the Board with a resolution delaying Congressional Action on the Internet Tax Moratorium. She stated that this resolution confirms that the County does not support the moratorium being extended past the October 1, 2001 deadline.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner Shank, seconded by Commissioner Ward, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Resolution on Delaying Congressional Action of Internet Tax Moratorium.

RESOLUTION ON DELAYING CONGRESSIONAL
ACTION OF INTERNET TAX MORATORIUM

WHEREAS out-of-state remote sellers who conduct sales via the Internet, mail order, and phone are not required by law to collect existing sales and use taxes imposed by state and local governments; and

WHEREAS the primary barrier to collecting taxes on remote sales is the Supreme Court's ruling in *Quill v. North Dakota* which defers to Congress to authorize states to require remote sellers to collect taxes in a manner that does not unduly burden Interstate commerce; and

WHEREAS state and local governments are working together to implement a streamlined sales tax system that would simplify definitions, tax rates and tax bases and use 21st Century technology in the collection process; and

WHEREAS current laws create a competitive disadvantage and great inequities between merchants who sell from traditional "brick-and mortar" establishments and those who sell from electronic stores; and

WHEREAS increasing sales on the Internet, and the resulting erosion of sales and use tax revenues, will limit the ability of states and governments and school districts to finance essential public services such as police, fire, emergency medical service, education, social services, infrastructure development, and healthcare; and

WHEREAS a recent University of Tennessee study estimates that state sales tax revenue losses in 2003 will exceed \$10 billion; and

WHEREAS the Advisory Commission on Electronic Commerce failed to reach a legally required consensus on fair and equitable treatment of both remote sellers and "Main Street" retailers and also proposed that Congress preempt state and local sovereignty guaranteed by the U. S. Constitution:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Pitt County supports simplification of state and local sales taxes, and urges states to move expeditiously to develop and approve model simplification legislation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Congress should not extend or expand the current

moratorium until its expiration in October 2001; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if state and local governments choose to negotiate a brief extension of the existing moratorium as part of a broader bill, such an extension:

- Should only be effective for a short period of time (no more than two years); and
- Must be linked to states' successfully implementing sales tax simplification, which would trigger Congressional authorization of expanded duty to collect use taxes on remote sales.

Schedule date for Courthouse Workshop – Phil Dickerson

Mr. Robinson said that he and Mr. Dickerson invited the Architect for the Courthouse to come to this Board meeting but he was able to attend. He stated there were some changes in the Phase 2 plans for the Courthouse that need to be discussed with the Board, as well as, review of the preliminary plans. Mr. Robinson said the Board needs to address the final recommendation on the plaque for the Courthouse.

The Board discussed possible meeting dates beginning with the latter part of July.

Vice Chairman Hammond suggested he would like for the construction of Phase I to be completed before starting on Phase II of the Courthouse construction.

Commissioner Owens suggested an evening meeting on August 9. Mr. Dickerson said it would be a long time to construct on Phase II if the planning is not started early. Commissioner Shank suggested the Community College needs could be combined with this meeting.

Commissioner James **motioned** for the Board to hold a workshop meeting to consider items on the Courthouse on August 9th at 8:30 a.m. Commissioner Ward seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

Lease for Clark Building at the Northwest Corner of Third and Washington Streets – Phil Dickerson

Mr. Robinson stated that Mr. Dickerson had been speaking with the owner of the Clark Building for a lease or sale of the property. He stated that Ms. Clark is not interested in selling at this time but would consider a lease arrangement.

Commissioner Owens said the Board has just completed a budget year and has suffered tremendously from the recent storm and flooding. He said the Manager called the Board in to discuss a \$1 million shortfall in the upcoming budget year. He said Manager had indicated there would be a shortfall year and that there may be some budget problems ahead and there may be a need to increase taxes in the future. Commissioner Owens said the revenues for the Education Compact will have to be generated. He said he did not think the County should go out

on a three- year lease on a piece of property that is later going to be purchased. He said he would like an overall plan from the Manager and Mr. Dickerson on space needs for the County. He reviewed the property purchases that have taken place since he's been on the Board. He asked for an overall view of space needs prior to making any decision on the Clark building.

Commissioner Owens **motioned** to table the lease for the Clark Building and the architectural contract for the new Administration Building until the staff can provide an overall view of space needs for the County. Commissioner James seconded the motion and commented on the budget and expenditures. Commissioner James said he wanted a list of debt payments from the Finance Officer. Commissioner Johnson said he opposed this motion because there needs to be additional space for Social Services and the Administration Building was the most reasonable way to meet these needs. Commissioner Shank said the Board needs to look forward and plan for the future. She said the more information they have the better they can plan. Commissioner Ward states she was in favor of Commissioner Johnson's comments and that she was in support of increasing space for Social Services. Vice Chairman Hammond said the County needs to have the Openhouse for the Courthouse and the Board needs to get rid of some projects before starting on new projects. Commissioner Bowen said from what he was hearing, the County could not afford to move forward with large projects with a \$1 million deficit.

Mr. Bob Shoffner, Public Defender, said that the State has deemed that the County has an obligation to provide office space for them. He said he has been the public defender since 1985 and he has not asked this Board for anything until now. He stated the legislation is such that what is spent on their office space is reimbursed by the State of North Carolina. He said they need space dearly and there was no need to study it to death. Mr. Dickerson said that there are facilities fees but they may not cover all the expenses. He also stated that Ms. Clark does not want to sell the building but it could be acquired by imminent domain. Commissioner James said that this space issue is another State mandate on the County.

Mr. Robinson said there are many pressing space needs and there are accommodations in the budget for Phase II of the Courthouse and Administration Building. He said he has put forth a Capital Improvement Plan for the Board to show these needs. He said the needs are real and are not going away but there are not sufficient revenues long term. Vice Chairman Hammond said some of the projects need to be curtailed. Commissioner James called for the question. Chairman Gaskins called for a vote on the motion. In favor of the motion were: Commissioner Owens, Commissioner James, Vice Chairman Hammond, Chairman Gaskins, Commissioner Bowen. All other commissioners were opposed. The motion passed with a five to four vote.

Architectural Contract for New Administration Building – Phil Dickerson

Item was deleted.

Schedule Joint Meeting for Final Approval of Education Compact – Tom Robinson

Mr. Robinson suggested the Board meet with the School Board but stated that this may need to wait until a little closer to the beginning of the school year. No action was taken.

Pitt Community College Courses - Commissioner Bowen

Commissioner Bowen said he heard a paid advertisement on a radio station offering courses in Spanish free but English speaking classes have a fee for the business course. If the course is free for Spanish, it should be free for all.

Keith Cooper request for Financial Assistance for Senior Citizens on Prescription Drugs

Vice Chairman Hammond stated that Keith Cooper asked to be on the agenda to discuss prescription drugs for senior citizens. He spoke about the drugs that are used for the elderly. He stated that after senior citizens pay for basic needs they can not afford to pay for prescription drugs. He said the County Manager budgeted \$800,000 for an animal shelter but he suggested a

supplemental fund could be established to help pay for senior citizens' prescription drugs. He suggested that a grantwriter could find an allocation to supplement such a fund or tap into an emergency fund or fund balance. He suggested partnerships with other agencies. He provided the Board with a supplemental fund proposal. He asked for the Board to adopt a resolution to set up a supplemental fund for seniors and form a committee to find ways to help senior citizens to pay for prescription drugs. Vice Chairman Hammond said that Social Services is already supplementing this need. Mr. Cooper said that he is speaking to seniors that do not qualify for that program. Commissioner Huggins asked if Mr. Cooper had some seniors that needed this funding other than the ones that qualify for the Social Services program. She asked that he start by getting the names and amount of citizens that need the service but do not qualify for the Social Services benefit. Mr. Cooper said that there are too many seniors that are left out of these programs because they do not qualify. He said he would be willing to get a precise number out of the 20,000 senior citizens in Pitt County.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS AND COMMENTS

- No comments were made.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner James, seconded by Commissioner Shank, the Board voted unanimously to go into closed session based on G.S. 143-381.11(a)(5) to establish or instruct the staff or agent concerning negotiations of the price and terms of a contract concerning the acquisition of real property.

UPON MOTION by Commissioner Bowen, seconded by Commissioner James, the Board voted unanimously to return to regular session.

Investment Companies Reconsidered

Mr. Robinson stated that Mr. Jones had called the investment firms to notify them of the Board's approval to use them as investment firms. Mr. Jones said that Tattersall had an internal policy that they would only serve customers with a \$10 million minimum and they declined to serve Pitt County because it would not be fair to their other clients.

Commissioner Ward noted that each firm's proposal was based on a \$15 million proposal. She asked if they had a third choice after Tattersall. Mr. Jones said they had selected Brown Brothers as the third choice but he had not checked references on any of the other choices. Commissioner James asked about the MDL firm. Mr. Jones said the selection process was very difficult but they had reservations about MDL because of the size of the firm and the relationship between the McCaskill Group and MDL. Commissioner Ward stated that if they had represented themselves as two groups in their proposals, they would not have been considered. She asked if the Board could give Mr. Jones the instructions to check references and move forward with Brown Brothers. Mr. Jones said he called Mr. Lay and asked about Mr. McCaskill's relationship with MDL. He said he was a third partner with MDL and provides marketing services for MDL. Vice Chairman Hammond said to give MDL an opportunity to perform and if they do not perform then terminate their services.

Chairman Gaskins asked for a recommendation. Mr. Jones said their next selection was Brown Brothers Harriman & Co.. Mr. Robinson said that Brown Brothers and Harriman have more years of service than some of the other firms. Brown Brothers Harriman & Co. may be a safer firm to go with because they have more history behind them. Mr. Robinson said from a return standpoint, MDL may offer higher returns. Commissioner Huggins suggested a smaller amount be given to the up and coming company, MDL, and then judge their performance. Ms. Bryan said that MDL has a shorter track record but it is a good track record. She said they do have a solid client list and they could check references. Ms. Bryan said that Brown Brothers Harriman & Co. is the oldest investment firm in the country. Chairman Gaskins suggested the staff think about this and come back to the Board with a recommendation.

Commissioner James **motioned** to investigate each of the firms in the fixed investments list, and if the investigation goes well then move forward with MDL; and further instructed the staff that an equal amount be split between the two firms for the initial investments. Vice Chairman Hammond seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

ADJOURN

UPON MOTION by Commissioner James, seconded by Commissioner Shank, the Board voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 12:05 p.m.
