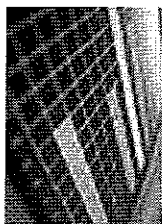

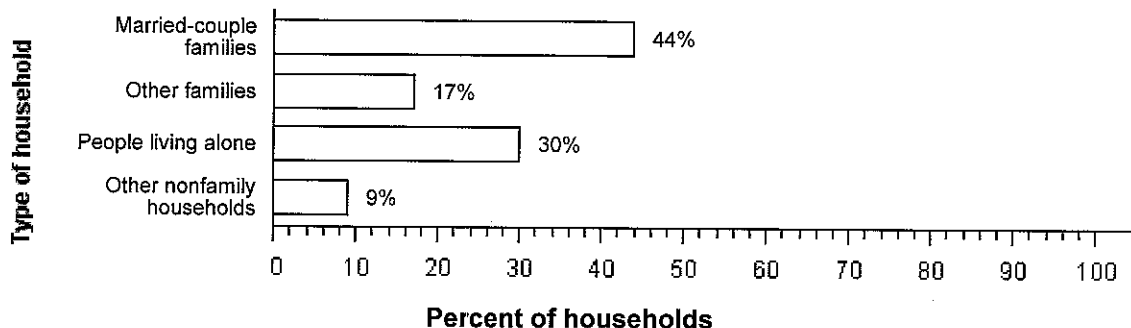
NOTE. Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.

HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2006 there were 62,000 households in Pitt County. The average household size was 2.2 people.

Families made up 61 percent of the households in Pitt County. This figure includes both married-couple families (44 percent) and other families (17 percent). Nonfamily households made up 39 percent of all households in Pitt County. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

The Types of Households in Pitt County, North Carolina in 2006

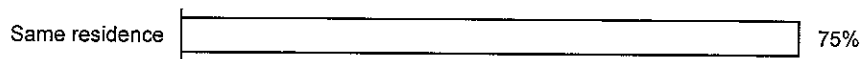


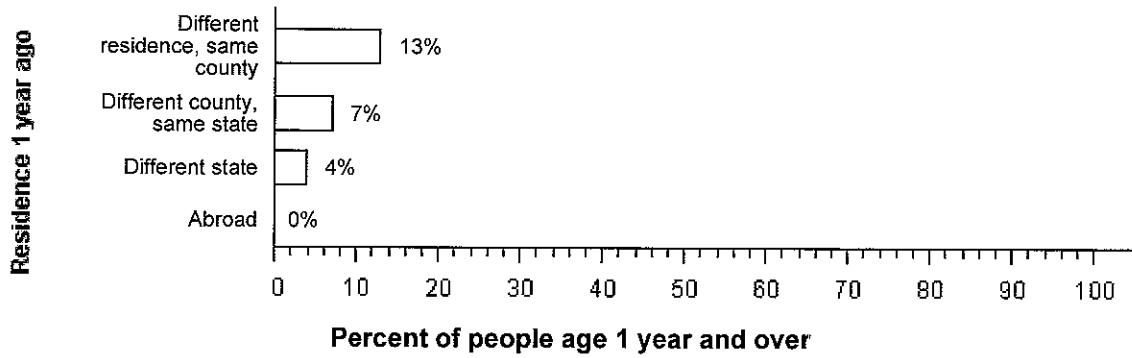

NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Data for this section cannot be displayed because the number of sample cases is too small. Displaying the data would risk disclosing information for individuals.

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2006, 75 percent of the people at least one year old living in Pitt County were living in the same residence one year earlier; 13 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 7 percent from another county in the same state, 4 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Pitt County, North Carolina in 2006



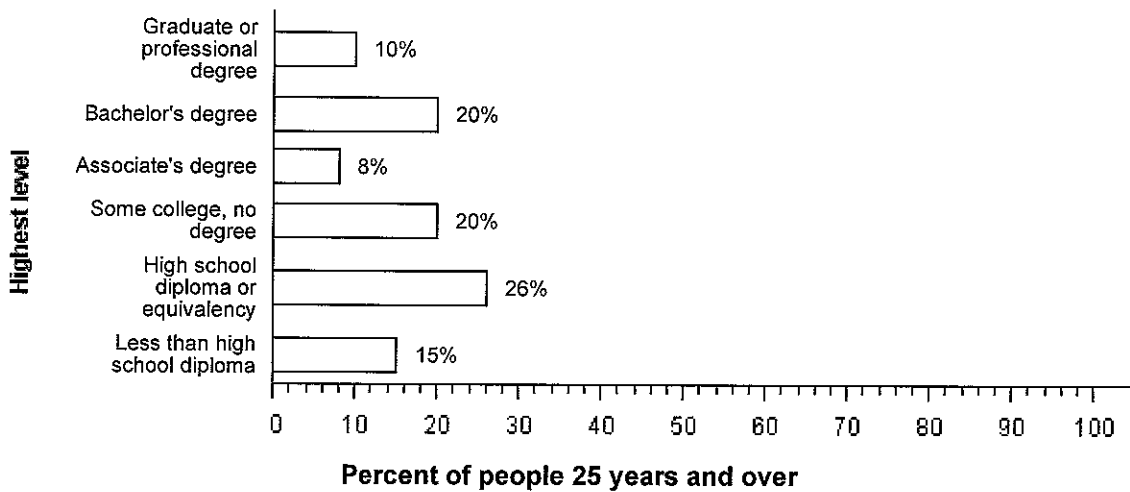

EDUCATION: In 2006, 85 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 31 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Fifteen percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Pitt County was 52,000 in 2006. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 6,100 and elementary or high school enrollment was 22,000 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 24,000.

The Educational Attainment of People in Pitt County, North Carolina in 2006

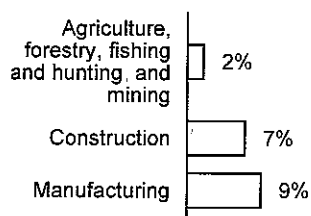


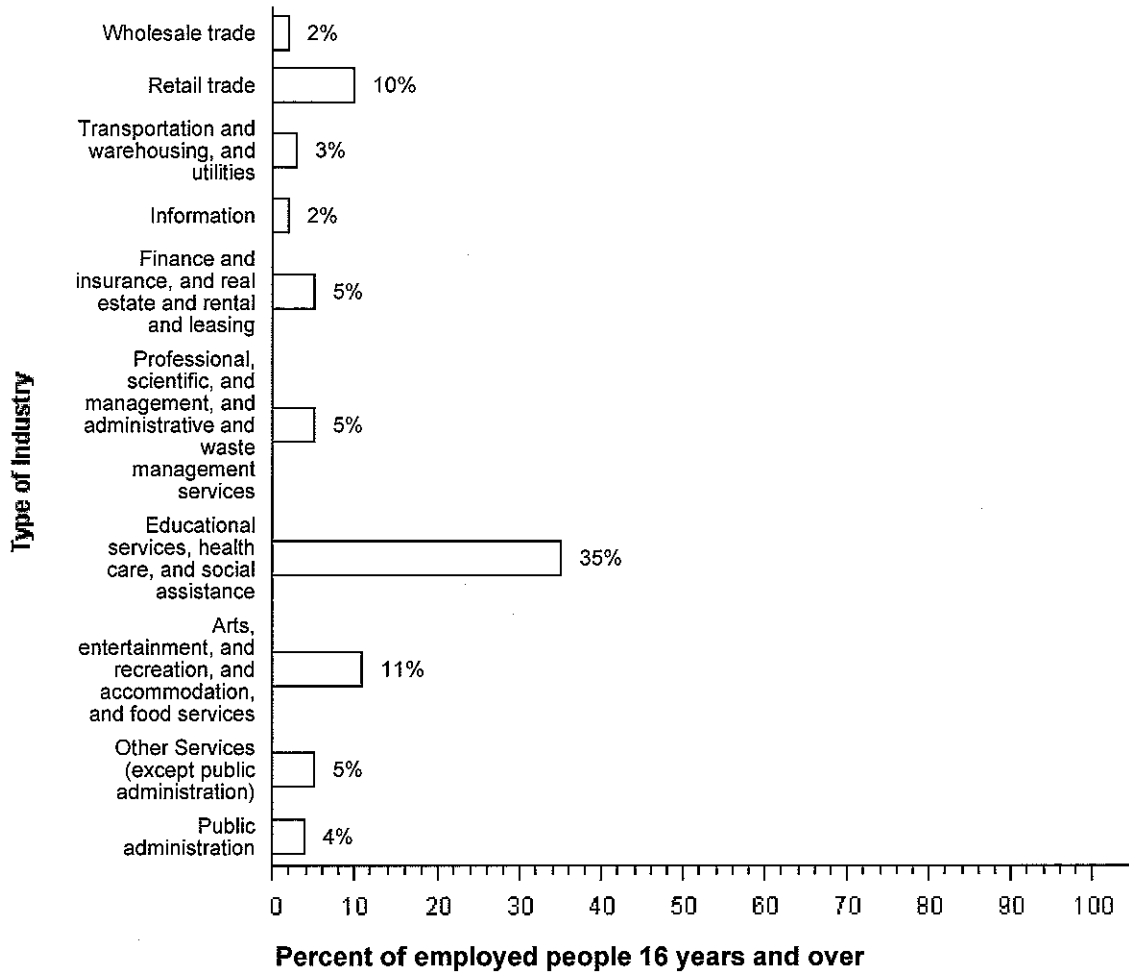

DISABILITY: In Pitt County, among people at least five years old in 2006, 15 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 9 percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to 12 percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to 44 percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2006, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Pitt County were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 35 percent, and Arts, entertainment, and recreation, and accommodation, and food services, 11 percent.

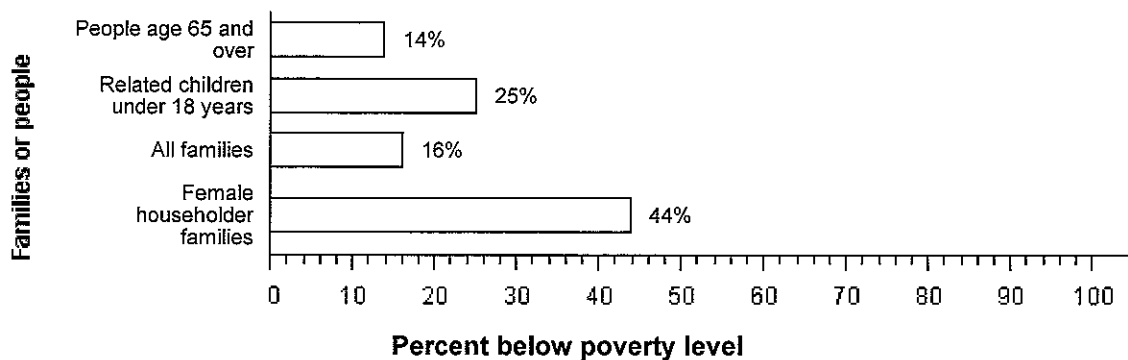
OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 40 percent; Sales and office occupations, 24 percent; Service occupations, 16 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 11 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance and repair occupations, 8 percent. Seventy-two percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 23 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 5 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Eighty-four percent of Pitt County workers drove to work alone in 2006, 8 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 6 percent used other means. The remaining 2 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 20 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Pitt County was \$36,782. Eighty-one percent of the households received earnings and 15 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-two percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$12,848. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2006, 22 percent of people were in poverty. Twenty-five percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 14 percent of people 65 years old and over. Sixteen percent of all families and 44 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

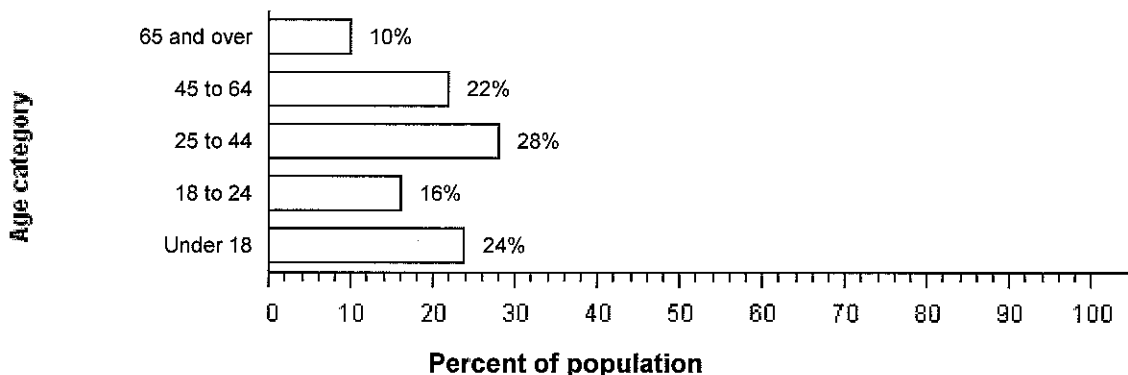
Poverty Rates in Pitt County, North Carolina in 2006

POPULATION OF Pitt County: In 2006, Pitt County had a total population of 146,000 - 76,000 (52 percent) females and 70,000 (48 percent) males. The median age was 32.2 years. Twenty-four percent of the population was under 18 years and 10 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Pitt County, North Carolina in 2006

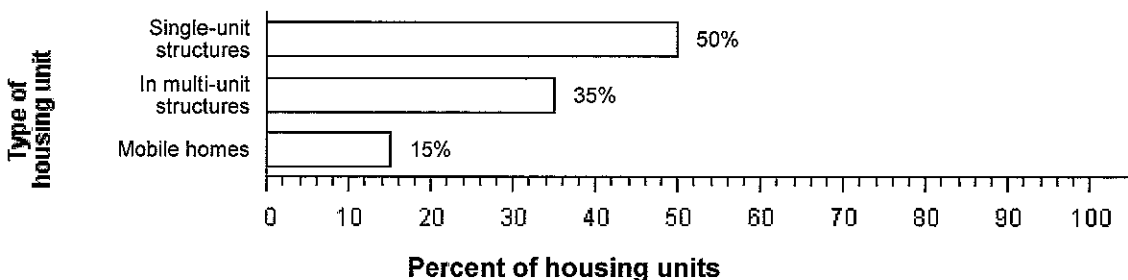

For people reporting one race alone, 62 percent was White; 34 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 1 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 2 percent was Some other race. Two percent reported Two or more races. Four percent of the people in Pitt County was Hispanic. Fifty-nine percent of the people in Pitt County was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2006, Pitt County had a total of 70,000 housing units, 11 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 50 percent was in single-unit structures, 35 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 15 percent was mobile homes. Forty-nine percent of the housing units were built since 1990

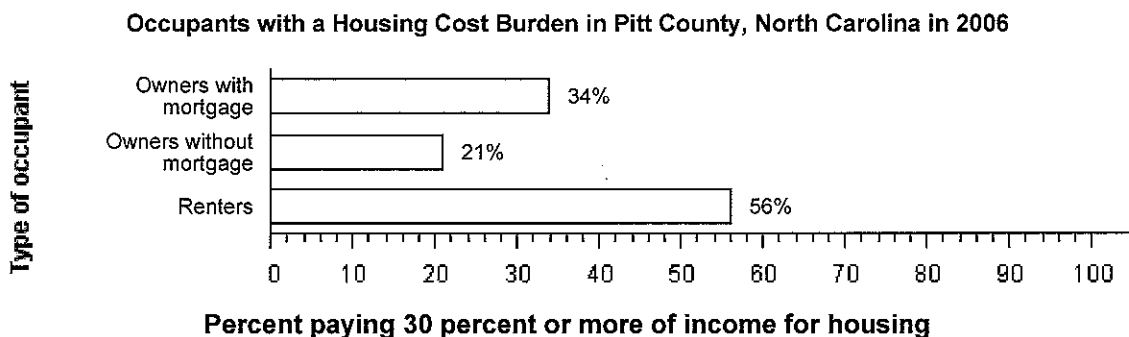
The Types of Housing Units in Pitt County, North Carolina in 2006

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2006, Pitt County had 62,000 occupied housing units - 35,000 (57 percent) owner occupied and 27,000 (43 percent) renter occupied. Five percent of the households did not have telephone service and 8 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Thirty-seven percent had two vehicles and another 20 percent had three or more

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,125, nonmortgaged owners \$376, and renters \$603. Thirty-four percent of owners with mortgages, 21 percent of owners without mortgages, and 56 percent of renters in Pitt County spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
